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Green Mountain Habitat for Humanity Partners With Local Philanthropist, Private Builder and Housing Trust

Williston, Vermont: Green Mountain Habitat for Humanity is partnering with Champlain Housing Trust, local Philanthropist Jan Blomstrann, and Sterling Construction to develop 100 homes in Hinesburg, Vermont. Of the 100 homes, 60% will be perpetually affordable and available to families who earn at or below 100% of the median household income for Chittenden County. One-third of the affordable homes, or about 20, will be more deeply affordable through Green Mountain Habitat for Humanity, available to families earning at or below 80% of the median income for the area. All homes in the development will be energy-efficient, maximize alternative energy sources, and the neighborhood will include sidewalks, trails, and playgrounds. This project will be the most extensive Habitat development in Vermont's history.

Green Mountain Habitat for Humanity (GMHFH) partners with people in Chittenden County and helps them build affordable places to live. GMHFH is a partnership, not a giveaway program—Habitat's homeowner families buy the houses that Habitat builds. Habitat homeowners also invest hundreds of hours of labor working alongside volunteers. As a result, the homes are affordable, and the families can build stability, equity, and self-reliance through homeownership. The program's success relies on financial donations, which allows the non-profit to purchase the land and building materials needed for its projects and community volunteers who help construct the homes. GMHFH also operates two Habitat for Humanity ReStores, one on Route 2A Williston and another on Route 7 in Milton, to bring in additional funding for the mission.
